

President's Report

Happy New Year! I hope that the summer has left you refreshed and ready for another fulfilling year.

In preparation for my term as MUFA President I perused our <u>Constitution</u>, and was pleased to remember that, "The Association shall concern itself with the quality of intellectual life at McMaster University and with the good name and reputation of the University among scholars of all academic disciplines," and furthermore that, "The Association supports the principle that faculty and senior academic librarians should play an active role in University governance". These foundational statements reminded me that all MUFA members are responsible for the governance and functioning of this institution.

I am thankful for the work of the elected members of MUFA's Executive, who have taken on specific responsibilities to support you, the members. You can learn more about our work on page 3 of this newsletter. This year the Executive will be examining MUFA's Constitution, By-Laws, and operating procedures to ensure that they allow us to serve our members well.

This is the second year of the three-year remuneration agreement that took effect in July 2022. In addition to the updates to salary and benefits that we negotiated on your behalf, we also agreed to the creation of three working groups:

• The Committee on Collecting and Reporting Salary Data for Equity-Deserving Groups issued a report in June 2023. Their work found that the university's demographic data about faculty is not adequate at present to allow this analysis. The good news, though, is that the forthcoming Employment Equity Census will provide data that will make this analysis possible.

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This is one of the reasons we will be urging you to complete that census once it becomes available!

- The **Working Group on Teaching Stream Faculty** has carried out a great deal of work in the past year and expects to report its findings in the near future.
- In our 2022 negotiations, members expressed interest in learning more about the prospect of a **Healthcare Spending Account (HSA)** as part of our compensation package. Joint Committee will soon be determining terms of reference for a committee to learn more about this benefits option. The committee's findings will inform our next round of negotiations in 2025. Please see page 3 for information about how to become a member of this committee.

The collegial governance of McMaster depends crucially on involvement from faculty members. Of course, the demands on faculty are such that it possible to devote all our time (and then some!) to teaching and research. But when we neglect service work, we forfeit our voice in the governance of the university. For this reason, I am immensely grateful to all faculty members whose work in committees, working groups, advisory councils, review boards, Senate, and many other venues contributes to keeping McMaster functioning as an innovative, diverse, and just scholarly community. I hope that all MUFA members will seek opportunities to lend your voice, your experience, and your expertise to the work of governance.

Represent MUFA on University Committees:

Are you looking for the opportunity to offer your voice as a faculty member on a university-level community? The following positions are vacant for 2023-24:

- The President's Advisory Committee on Relations with the Community provides an open forum for respectful dialogue and ongoing collaboration between McMaster University and members of its neighbouring communities. The committee meets four times per year.
- The <u>Rudy Heinzl Award for Excellence Committee</u> is operated by the McMaster Student Union (MSU). The committee typically has one meeting per year to select the recipient of the award, which is granted to a member of the McMaster community in recognition of an outstanding one-year achievement that improves the lives of McMaster students
- The <u>Sexual Violence Prevention and Response Task</u>
 <u>Force</u> supports the work of the Sexual Violence Prevention and Response Office (SVPRO). The Task Force meets quarterly to advise and provide input on SVPRO's practices and policies.

Classroom Telephones:

UTS, the Registrar's Office and Campus Classroom Technologies have partnered to provide phones in all Registrar Controlled classrooms for your safety and convenience and to provide immediate access to various campus services. Quick access buttons have been programmed to the telephones for direct calling to McMaster Security Services, Facility Services, and Campus Classroom Technologies (CCT).

Assistive Listening Devices:

<u>Assistive Listening Devices</u> (ALD) are personal hearing devices that can be used along with hearing aids or with head-phones to enhance the listening experience. Several classrooms at McMaster University include ALD systems that work with classroom microphones and presentation sound. Personal ALD receivers can be borrowed from McMaster University Library.

Echo360 - Lecture Capture: Echo360 is a complete video recording, hosting, and delivery platform available for free to the McMaster community. It can be integrated into Avenue to Learn or it can be used as a standalone tool. Use Echo360 to capture and live stream lecture content, to engage with students through interactive activities, and to track student interaction with course material. It combines all of the video capabilities you need into a single solution.

Avenue to Learn and Echo360 Integration:

Integrating Echo360 from Within Your Avenue Course Shell

Integrate Echo360 into Avenue to Learn for a seamless experience. Add Echo360 as an External Learning Tool or embed Echo360 videos into Avenue to Learn modules. This process only requires a few quick steps.

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To schedule automatic recordings of lectures in an Echo360 enabled room: send a request to cct@mcmaster.ca with the following information:

- 1. Course code, course name, section name (eg. CO1) and term
- 2. Instructor email address
- 3. Building and room number
- 4. Class schedule, including days and times for lectures
- 5. Will the recording also be live-streamed?
- 6. Do you want the recorded video to be made available immediately or delay the availability? You may wish to delay student access to give you time to make any timeline edits.
- 7. Do you want the video content to become unavailable to students after a period of days?
- 8. Will the recordings be shared through Avenue to Learn? If so, has Echo360 been added as an external learning tool?

Echo360 Training and Support: if you would like to book a one-on-one orientation session, you can <u>Schedule a Meeting</u>.

Meeting Owl Pro:

Meeting Owl Pro is a 360-degree camera, mic, and speaker combined into one easy-to-use device. It creates the experience of inperson participation for hybrid teams and integrates seamlessly with the conferencing platforms you already use. We have put together a portable kit with a tripod that Instructors can borrow and use in classrooms that do not have the needed technology already. It is available to borrow through the main service desk of Mills and Thode Library. If you would like a demonstration, please contact us to set up an orientation.

How to Apply for the External Tuition Bursary Benefit

This process describes the **two-part process** required to apply for the External (non-McMaster) Tuition Bursary Benefit for dependents and spouses. For more information about this program, including eligibility, visit https://hr.mcmaster.ca/tuitionbenefit.

Part 1: Complete and Submit the Application Form between November 1 and July 30

Things to know:

- More than one Application Form can be submitted for each dependant/spouse for eligibility review.
 Each application can be submitted for a single term or for multiple terms. If applying for multiple terms, please ensure that you are providing supporting documentation for each of those terms.
- 1. Log into Mosaic.
- 2. Click the **Mosaic Home** dropdown menu and select **Employee Self Service**.



3. Click the **External Tuition Bursary Form** tile to open the
External Tuition Bursary Landing
Page.



 From the Nav Collection on the left-hand side of the screen, click Application Form.



Note: If the Nav Collection is not visible, click the tab at the left-side of screen to unhide.



- Complete the form and upload the required supporting documentation for each applicable academic term selected:
 - Proof of Enrolment this can include (but is not limited to) a letter from the educational institution confirming enrolment and/or a statement of account or invoice of fees. Proof must include the name of the institution and name of program/degree the student is enrolled in
 - Proof that Courses are required for completion of an undergraduate or graduate degree, or a College Diploma - this is usually in the form of an unofficial academic transcript or copy/link of the academic calendar page detailing program/degree course requirements.
- Click **Submit** to complete Part 1 of the application.
 Applicants will be advised via email whether their application has been pre-approved or denied.

Part 2: Complete and Submit the Payment Application Form between November 1 and September 30

Things to know:

- Only submit <u>one</u> Payment Application Form for each dependant/spouse each academic year. All approved Application Forms for the dependant/spouse should be added to the Payment Application Form.
- Log into Mosaic and navigate to Employee Self Service to access the External Tuition Bursary Landing Page.
- Download the <u>Dependant & Spouse Declaration of</u> <u>Consent Form</u> and have your dependant/spouse sign the form.
- From the Nav Collection on the left-hand side of the screen, click Payment Application Form to open the form.



 In the Application Details section, click the search icon in the **Application Form ID** field to view your pre-approved Application Forms.



5. Select the Application Form(s) that you wish to submit the Payment Application Form for.



The Application Form ID will now appear in the Application form ID field.



Note: If there are multiple approved Application Forms for the same dependant/spouse, click **Insert a Row** to add all forms to a single Payment Application Form.



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How to Apply for the External Tuition Bursary Benefit

- Complete the remainder of the Payment Application Form, being sure to upload the required supporting documentation (all fields are mandatory):
 - Proof of Payment of Tuition, e.g., account statement showing tuition fees paid
 - Proof of Completion of the Courses and/or Programs, e.g., Academic transcript (PDF copies are acceptable) or proof of academic standing.
 - · Signed Dependant & Spouse Declaration of Consent
- 7. Click **Submit** to complete Part 2 of the application for the benefit.

Notes:

- Applicants will be advised via email whether their Payment Application has been approved or denied.
 A follow up email to approved applicants is also sent to confirm that amount that will be paid to the dependent/spouse.
- Dependants/spouses will receive payment annually in November/December.
- Dependants/spouses will be issued with a T4A in February.

McMaster University retirees continue to give back to the university

Members of Canada's longest-running university retiree association contribute to research, aging initiatives and planning.

The McMaster University Retirees Association (MURA) is one of the oldest and largest university retiree associations in the country. In addition to fostering retirees' connections to each other and being a voice to support our members, MURA's original purposes were to contribute in as many ways as possible to the welfare, prestige and excellence of the university and to promote interest in, cooperation with, and support of the university.

The association still espouses those principles. Its members come from faculty and staff, unionized and non-unionized roles and from education, research, administrative and support backgrounds. Our retirees have a shared interest in maintaining connections with and contributing to the university, often by using the same skills used during their paid employment. Connections are maintained through an observer role on the university's board of governors, as well as MURA representatives on the pension planning and oversight committees. A university human resources representative attends MURA council meetings and MURA liaises regularly with university departments to ensure a mutually smooth communication flow. Recently, retirees were given the opportunity to provide feedback on the university's next strategic plan.

MURA is fortunate that there is an emphasis at McMaster on research into aging, especially aging well in the community, and that we have a cadre of retired, dedicated professionals who wish to be involved in relevant and meaningful endeavours such as those presented by research. We have embraced this opportunity from both sides, and as a result have forged links between MURA and the research community at the university.

MURA members contribute to this research in a number of ways. First, of course, we are a ready and willing population of research subjects. We regularly receive invitations to participate in research projects led by faculty, graduate and undergraduate students. But we are also involved to a greater degree as liaisons on institute com-

mittees and as participants in planning retreats. Below are some of the local organizations that retirees are involved with:

- The Hamilton Aging in Community group is led by a group of older adults, including a (semi) retired McMaster faculty member. The group is dedicated to finding and disseminating mutual support strategies for maturing adults and seniors. They produce a semi-monthly community newsletter that is distributed to MURA members.
- The McMaster Optimal Aging Portal, under the auspices of the Labarge Optimal Aging Initiative, provides direct and easy access to evidence-based information on health and social conditions to help people stay healthy, active and engaged as they grow older.
- The university is associated with **Hamilton Third Age Learning**, which provides learning and enrichment opportunities for adults aged 50+. McMaster retirees have held leadership positions in this volunteer organization, and opportunities are disseminated to our members.
- MURA provides a liaison to the McMaster site of the **Age Friendly University (AFU)** network, a global body made up of higher education institutions that are committed to becoming more universally accessible.

The McMaster Institute for Research on Aging (MIRA) operates within the AFU initiative. MIRA is dedicated to optimizing the health and longevity of the aging population through leading edge research, education and stakeholder collaboration. MURA is one of those stakeholders, as we have a council member who acts as a liaison with MIRA.

Providing liaison with McMaster institutes and researchers involved in aging initiatives means that we have a direct link to provide input and feedback on research direction. All parties benefit from these arrangements. The researchers have access to research subjects, as well as to knowledgeable and experienced professionals who offer their expertise. MURA members benefit from being en-

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gaged in meaningful activities that maintain their connection with the university. The strength of the partnership is evidenced by increased solicitations from university researchers and organizations for involvement by our retiree group.
