A Fall Term Update

MUFA has been engaged with several developments so far. Here are updates on the most important issues that I thought members may find helpful:

- 1. Working Conditions during COVID-19 Pandemic: Several positive measures have been taken so far to mitigate the negative impacts of the pandemic on faculty working conditions: (1) Extension of Timeline for Academic Assessments (SPS B13), (2) Special Considerations for Career Progress and Merit (CP/M) for 2020 and (3) Revised Guidelines for Reimbursing Employees During the Pandemic. While these measures have alleviated the pandemic impact to some extent, they are not sufficient as they cover only some aspects of the faculty working conditions and were not setup with an understanding that the pandemic conditions will be extended at least to April 2021. We are in the process of reviewing these measures, and based on feedback from the recent MUFA survey on equity as well as the November 13th meeting with the MUFA Council, we will work on proposals to both extend and expand COVID-19 accommodations. We have also heard from many of our members about concerns about downloading support services functions to faculty members (such as Student Accessibility Services (SAS) exam invigilation, final exams invigilation and research plagiarism checking for graduate theses). These and other ongoing issues have been discussed by the Executive and the Joint Committee and solutions, even if temporary, have been worked out.
- 2. Policy Review: We are in the process of reviewing MUFA as well as University policies. As part of an effort to move to a new MUFA web site, and to follow the web content accessibility guidelines to confirm with the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA), we are reviewing MUFA policies. Depending on the state of the policy, they may be kept as they are, reviewed or revoked. We started with legal support policies. We are currently working on a draft for a policy to provide legal support to members after having revoked two policies that date back to 1994/5 since



they no longer apply. Next in line are the Librarian policies that will need some housekeeping to reflect changes that occurred after the formation of the McMaster University Academic Librarian's Association (MUALA). As for University policy, an exploratory committee has started its work to look at what may need to be reviewed in the Tenure and Promotion Policy to ensure that it supports equity, diversity and inclusion. We have also started discussions about the Faculty Reduced Workload Policy — Phase-in to Retirement (SPS C6) where some concerns have been identified and we plan to work on a draft proposal to address those concerns. Finally, and as an effort to support interdisciplinary research and teaching, early discussions have started with the Provost on having clear guidelines on the assessment for faculty that have cross-Faculty appointments.

- **3.** Pay Equity: We are in the midst of a data collection from the Faculties about starting salaries during the last 10 years. This will take longer than expected given the pandemic situation and that some data collection will involve going through physical hiring records. We are also gathering information through meetings with Deans as well as new faculty and the recent MUFA Equity Survey. Once data is collected, we will revisit the analysis done on the gender salary gap and work on possible remedies. We have also had some discussions with Human Resources and it appears that there may be a way to access data that would allow us to perform a wider equity analysis that is inclusive of other visible minorities.
- **4. Pre-Bargaining**: As per the terms of our last negotiation round we needed to establish two subcommittees to look into pension and retiree benefits plans outstanding issues. The pension subcommittee has finished its work and you would have received a link to its final report by email in late September. A retiree benefits subcommittee has been formed and will soon start its work. The MUFA members on that committee are Catherine Anderson and Laura Parker. Catherine, who also serves as the Chair of the Remuneration Committee, attends the OCUFA Collective Bargaining Committee meetings where updates are provided on ongoing bargaining in other universities as well as implications of Bill 124 and the court challenge that was mounted in early 2020 by a labour coalition that includes OCUFA.

Through our engagement with the Administration, OCUFA and CAUT, the Executive has also been monitoring external developments that are relevant to faculty and the University. We have learned that the third wave of Strategic Mandate Agreements (SMA3) will be posted online soon. Due to COVID-19, the government has delayed the adoption of outcome-based funding for two years.

For more details and further updates, watch out for an invite to attend the General Meeting on December 10th at 11:00 a.m. I look forward to e-meeting you at the GM.

Revised Guidelines for Reimbursing Employees During Covid 19 Pandemic

Originally posted: March 31, 2020 Updated: June 4, 2020

McMaster University is committed to supporting employees who are required to work from home during the COVID-19 pandemic as outlined in <u>Information for Supporting Remote Work Arrangements</u>. Consistent with the goal of supporting employees, reimbursement is now available for supplies required to work at home.

Allowable expenses?

- Overcharges for excess internet and cell phone usage required in order to complete work
- Long distance charges for work-related calls
- Printer cartridges or toner
- Stationery (e.g. paper, pens, highlighters)
- Laptops, monitors, printers and related computer equipment only when pre-authorized by the department. These items will become the property of McMaster.
- Office equipment and accessories only when pre-authorized by the supervisor in accordance with <u>Information for</u>
 <u>Remote Work Office Set-Up for employees working remotely during COVID-19 Pandemic</u>. These items will become the property of McMaster.
- Other reasonable supply (non-capital) expenses as authorized by your supervisor.

It is recommended that purchases be approved in advance by your supervisor. In the case of expenses charged to a research project, the approval by the supervisor will confirm that these expenditures are directly related to research. Eligibility of expenditures to a research project are subject to the sponsor policies and guidelines. Please contact your respective Research Finance office to confirm expense eligibility.

Employee eligibility?

Any employee who has been asked to temporarily work remotely by their supervisor in accordance with the state of emergency implemented by the Province of Ontario in response to COVID-19, and in accordance with the <u>Supervisor</u> Guide: A Decision Matrix for Establishing Working from Home Arrangements.

Procedure?

Employees are encouraged to purchase required supplies through MacBuy. Charge your regular department, research or other project using account 600900 (Misc. Supplies Covid 19). Contact macbuyhelp@mcmaster.ca for access and assistance.

Otherwise, use the Mosaic Travel and Expense (T&E) module to upload receipts and complete the claim which will allow direct reimbursement to your bank account, after approvals (by your Purpose Approver), when applicable, your Research Finance Office when charging a project, and AP. There is a new expense type in T&E called Misc. Supplies Covid 19. Charge your regular department, research or other project using account 600900 (Misc. Supplies Covid 19). Refer to Reimbursements to Individuals for University Business (AP-01) and Strategic Procurement Policy (SP-01) for more details if necessary. The university is tracking extra costs incurred during the pandemic for discussions with government and other stakeholders.
